Step into a new head space

Course Bachelor of psychology (honours).

With mental health on the public agenda, opportunities abound for psychologists to make a difference.

“The bachelor of psychology (with honours) prepares graduates to work to improve psychological and neurocognitive wellbeing and to conduct research that translates into societal impact,” says the course convener from Monash University’s school of psychology and psychiatry, Penelope Hasking.

For those wishing to practise psychology or become a member of the Australian Psychological Society, honours study is often the first step to a successful career in the field (access based on third-year results).

Throughout the bachelor’s degree, students gain broad, interdisciplinary knowledge of psychology and a deep understanding of specific areas, such as brain injury, culture and mental health, forensic behavioural science, neurodevelopment and mood, movement and sleep disorders.

Duration Four years with exit point at three years without honours.

Time A six-credit-point unit equates to about 12 hours a week of classes and self-study.

Where On campus at Monash University’s Clayton campus.

When Intake semester one only.
